Students will arrive to the studio, watch a quick demo and use the menus to select their own creative path for their art time. Our first drawing exercise was OBSERVATIONAL DRAWING. I brought in sunflowers from market. They may elect to practice my demonstration of value in pencil. They may also choose to use Le Pen with Sharpie or colored pencil. They might also choose another object in the room. We continue though, and offer more choices in DRAWING, students show their teacher they can handle more choices before we open another center.
